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| Classification | Skin Care: Advanced Moisturizer – Urea 10% | |
| Key Points | Moisturizing cream containing 10% urea and 4% Alpha Hydroxy Acid (AHA); AHA removes the dead dry skin allowing the urea moisturizer to penetrate into the skin. May sting if applied to irritated, broken skin. | |
| Indications | For treatment of extremely dry, scaly, and/or cracked skin; especially the lower legs. For clients with diabetes and/or renal failure who have extremely dry skin. | |
| Precautions | Do not use as a basic moisturizer unless there is a client specific order from Physician/NP/ NSWOC/Wound Clinician. Avoid contact with eyes. If applying to a large area, test the cream in a small area first to assess client's tolerance. AHA may increase the skin's sensitivity to the sun; wear sunscreen and protective clothing and limit exposure to sun. Discontinue use if a skin irritation develops. | |
| Contraindications | Do not use for clients with known sensitivity or allergy to urea and/or AHA.Do not use on open wounds. | |
| Formats & Sizes | Tube 60 ml 140 ml Sachet 2 g | CONCECTOR Concector |
| Application Directions | | Rationale |
| Label tube with the date and the client's name. | | The tube is for single-patient use only. The expiry date is on the tube. |
| Gently apply a small amount of cream to clean, dried areas, spreading cream onto the skin until it is dry to the touch. Do not massage any reddened areas caused by pressure. | | Massaging to reddened areas caused by pressure may increase damage. |
| Do not apply between toes. | | |
| Repeat application 2-3 times per day. | | |
| Expected Outcome | | |
| Dry, scaly/cracked skin will show signs of improvement within 2 weeks. | | |
