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Application of Devok			
Application of Pouch			
Place the measuring guide at the base of the penis and find the			
correct penis size.			
Trace a circle with the measured diameter onto the paper backing			
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of the pouch; cut the pouch slightly larger than the diameter of			
the penis.			
Close the cap-end of the pouch.			
Remove the paper backing from the adhesive side of the pouch			
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With one hand, smooth out the scrotal tissue as much as possible,			
and with the other hand, apply the adhesive side of the pouch to			
the scrotal area with the penis centered in the opening.			
Hold the pouch in place for a minute as the warmth will help to			
activate the adhesive of the pouch.			
For the SoftElev neuch, the four paper tane strips may be used			
For the SoftFlex pouch, the four paper tape strips may be used			
along the edge of the barrier ring of the pouch for additional			
securement.			
Uncap the pouch and attach tubing to a gravity drainage urine			
collector.			
Daily Care			
Monitor skin around the collection device every 2 hours for			
leakage.			
Frequency of Change			
If the client is not circumcised, the pouch should be removed for			
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daily hygiene beneath the foreskin.			
Remove the pouch immediately if any skin irritation is noted or if			
urine is leaking from beneath the skin barrier.

Removal of Device			
Disconnect the spout from the urinary drainage collector and			
close the cap the pouch drain.			
Gently peel back the skin barrier from the client's skin. Assess for			
redness or skin breakdown.			
Expected Outcome			
Peri-genital skin remains intact.			
Urine output is monitored.
