On Admission Braden/BradenQ Risk & Skin Assessment Schedule For all patients/clients/residents		
Emergency Room (ER)	On admission	
Adult ICU/CCU; Pediatrics ICU (PICU); Neonatal ICU (NICU)	As part of the admission process, within 8 hours of admission	
Operating Room (OR)	Need to be knowledgeable of the pre-operative Braden Scale risk score	
Acute Inpatient Units Medical/Surgical Units Sub-Acute Medical, Transitional/ Discharge Planning/Activation, Palliative Care, Psychiatric Units	As part of the admission process, within 8 hours of admission, and upon return from the OR	
Rehabilitation Units	As part of the admission process, within 8 hours of admission.	
Community Care (Clinic or Home)	As part of the admission process, within the first 2 visits	
Residential Care	As part of the admission process; within 24 hours of admission.	

Ongoing Assessments Braden/BradenQ Risk & Skin Assessment Schedule For adults with Braden score <u>18 or less</u> (at risk to very high risk) or for children with Braden Q score <u>15 or less</u> (moderate to very high risk)		
Emergency Room (ER)	Every shift	
Adult ICU/CCU; Pediatrics ICU (PICU); Neonatal ICU (NICU)	Every shift	
Acute Inpatient Units Medical/Surgical Units Sub-Acute Medical, Transitional/ Discharge Planning/Activation, Palliative Care, Psychiatric Units	Every shift	
Rehabilitation Units	Daily.	
Community Care (Clinic or Home)	At every visit within the first 3 weeks, then transition to quarterly (every 3 months)	
Residential Care	Weekly for 3 weeks/until initial RAI-MDS Assessment is done. Do a Braden with each subsequent quarterly & annual RAI-MDS where PURS is greater than 0.	
Do a Braden Assessment whenever: the client condition has deteriorated; the client has been transferred; the client has been hospitalized		

Ongoing Assessments Skin Assessment Schedule For adults with a Braden score 19 or greater and for children with Braden Q score 16 or greater		
Emergency Room (ER)	Every shift	
Adult ICU/CCU; Pediatrics ICU (PICU); Neonatal ICU (NICU)	Every shift	
Acute Inpatient Units Medical/Surgical Units Sub-Acute Medical, Transitional/ Discharge Planning/Activation, Palliative Care, Psychiatric Units	At least daily	
Rehabilitation Units	With bathing	
Community Care (Clinic or Home)	When condition has deteriorated/changed	
Residential Care	With bathing	
Do a Braden Assessment whenever: the client condition has deteriorated: the client has been transferred: the client has been hospitalized
