# Additional Education Requirements & Competencies Competency Checklist

# Negative Pressure Wound Therapy Level Two: Dressing Application

Negative Pressure Wound Therapy (NPWT) has two levels of competency:

- NPWT Level One: Monitor & Manage for nurses responsible for the monitoring and managing of patients/clients/residents who are receiving NPWT.
- NPWT Level Two: Dressing Application for nurses responsible for applying NPWT dressings.

#### Indications for Use of this Document

• This document guides the testing of nurses' knowledge in NPWT dressing application principles and their skill in doing unit/site specific NPWT dressings.

#### **Practice Level:**

- In British Columbia: to apply a NPWT dressing, Registered Nurses (RNs), Registered Psychiatric Nurses (RPNs), and Licenced Practical Nurses (LPNs), in accordance with the British Columbia College of Nurses and Midwifes' scope of practice for their specific designation and as per their Health Authority(HA)/agency policy, must:
  - Have a policy supporting their designation in applying NPWT dressings.
  - o Have HA/agency approved NPWT decision support tools, (e.g. guideline and procedures).
  - Successfully complete additional education for monitoring & managing a NPWT system.
  - Have successfully completed the additional education requirements for NPWT dressing application.
  - Have client-specific NPWT orders.
  - o In addition, LPNs follow an established NPWT wound treatment plan.
- In the Yukon Registered Nurses, Registered Psychiatric Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses are to refer to organizational policy and practice in accordance with regulatory bodies.

#### **Pre-requisites:**

- Basic Wound Care education as defined by the HA/agency.
- NPWT Level One: Monitor & Manage Additional Education Requirements.

#### **Lesson Plan:**

The <u>lesson plan</u> consists of learning activities to assist in knowledge acquisition and skill development in how to apply a NPWT dressing for an open wound or closed incision and how to manage skin graft dressing.

### **Competency Checklist:**

A checklist (<u>page 3</u>) consists of both verbalization of NPWT dressing principles that are applicable for all dressings regardless of the NPWT device being used and demonstration of skill in doing a device-specific NPWT dressing. The nurse needs to be competent for only those NPWT dressings that are done on their specific unit/site.

## **Definitions:**

**Additional Education Requirements (AERs)** - Structured education (e.g., a workshop, course or program of study) designed so that nurses can attain the competencies required to carry out a specific activity as part of nursing practice. Additional education builds on the entry-level competencies of the nurse, identifies the competencies expected of the nurse, includes both knowledge and skill to practice and includes an objective evaluation of the nurses' competency by a nursing mentor<sup>1</sup>.

- **Competency** The integration and application of knowledge, skills and judgment required for safe and appropriate performance in an individual's practice<sup>1</sup>.
- **Negative Pressure Wound Therapy (NPWT)** An advanced wound therapy that delivers either continuous or intermittent/dynamic negative sub-atmospheric pressure (mmHg) to the wound, incision or graft.
- **Nurse Mentor -** A Clinical Nurse Educator, Nurse Specialized in Wound, Ostomy & Continence (NSWOC), Wound Clinician (WC) or delegated nurse competent in the skill being demonstrated.

12.	Identify reasons why NPWT therapy should be continued or discontinued and who to inform if the situation indicates the therapy should be discontinued.		
13.	Identify what products could be used to obtain a dressing seal.		
14.	Articulate why the periwound skin needs to be protected from the NPWT foam dressings and how to this.		
15.	Describe situations where a wound interface is recommended and what interface options could be used.		
16.	Describe the appropriate method of filling dead space and the risks with either under-filling or over-filling.		
17.	Identify rationale for positioning the tubing for ADLs and safety.		
18.	Articulate what issues needs to be reported in the Patient Safely Learning System.		
19.	If applicable to unit/site: articulates the cleansing process for a used NPWT multi-use device.
