Classification	Skin Care: Cleanser – No Rinse		
British Columbia Practice	 The British Columbia Perinatal Services and the British Columbia Provincial Nursing Skin & Wound Committee have determined Remedy Cleanse No Rinse may be used as a no-rinse or a rinse-off cleanser (see specific application below) for neonates in: NICUs with a corrected gestational age greater than 31 weeks + 6 days. Maternity/pediatric units who are less than 28 days in age. 		
Key Points	 Remedy Clinical Cleanse No-Rinse Cleanser is a no-rinse pH-balanced, plant-derived moisturizing foam cleanser for skin and hair. May be used on intact and non-intact skin. Fragrance free, tear free, hypoallergenic, paraben free, sulfate free. Chlorhexidine Gluconate (CHG) compatible. Compatible with latex, nitrile, and vinyl gloves. 		
Indications	 For all ages including neonates (see practice statement above) for: Bathing (bed or basin), perineal cleansing, hair cleansing. The removal of zinc-based ointments. 		
Precautions	May be used for cleansing eyelids/lashes but avoid direct contact to the eye.		
Contraindications	 Do not use for clients with known sensitivity or allergy to product ingredients. Do not use for neonates who have a corrected gestational age of less than 31weeks + 6 days. Do not use as a wound cleanser.

Select the size of bottle appropriate to the client situation,	The bottle is for single-patient use only and is to be used
(e.g., for short stay consider the 118 mL sized bottle).	within three years of opening.
Label the bottle with the date and the client's name.	
Application	
Bathing (bed or basin) all ages except neonates (see below)	Do not use in the shower.
A maximum of 10 pumps is all that is needed for a complete	
bath:	
 Moisten a soft, reusable or disposable cloth with warm water. 	
 Use the palm of the hand to dispense 1-3 pumps of the cleanser onto the washcloth. 	
• Cleanse the skin gently; <u>do not rinse</u> with water; pat skin dry.	Cleanser is a no-rinse product and leaves an invisible

Bathing for neonates:	
• Use the foam cleanser to wash the infant's hair and body as

Hair cleansing:			
Apply to wet or dry hair.	Product does not produce suds.

• Towel dry.			
Perineal cleansing:			
Gently remove as much of the feces as possible:			
• Moisten a washcloth with warm water. Use the palm of the			
hand to dispense 3-6 pumps of the cleanser on to the			
washcloth. More pumps can be used.			
<u>Or</u>			
• Pump directly onto perineal skin/soiling on skin/zinc barrier.			
For caked-on, dried soiled areas, allow the foam to soak in			
for 2-3 minutes to aid in cleansing.			
 Wipe gently and repeat as necessary.

Prevent).			
Removal of Zinc Cream:			
 Pump directly onto the zinc area. 			
• Allow the foam to soak in for 2-3 minutes to aid in removing			
cream.			
• Wipe gently off the top layer of zinc and repeat if needed.
